Program Requirements

The Master of Science in Counselor Education requires the completion of 60 semester hours. The program includes three professional specialization options: Clinical Mental Health Counseling (CMHC), School Counseling (SC) and Student Affairs and College Counseling (SACC). Depending upon professional specialization and program of study, graduates of the program may be endorsed for licensure with the North Carolina Board of Licensed Professional Counselors and/or the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction (S-Level).
